SYDNEY: A 32-year-old man was charged yesterday with causing serious affront and alarm, and released on unconditional bail to appear on August 30, following an incident at the NSW Art Gallery in which a man who said he was a member of the BUGAUP organisation, opposed to cigarette advertising, chained himself to a car bearing the name Marlboro, in protest against the Philip Morris company sponsoring an exhibition at the gallery.
